

Flight regulations Braunsberg



The Braunsberg model flying site is under the patronage of the 1st HMS and subject to the requirements of Art. 16 of the EU regulation 2019/947 since 2023.

§1: Model flying in the area of the Braunsberg model flying site is only permitted in compliance with these flight regulations and the model flying site operating regulations (MFBO) for Braunsberg. Each pilot confirms that he/she has taken note of these rules by making an entry in the flight logbook.

§2: The entry in the digital flight logbook (www.hms.wien) is mandatory for all pilots at the start of their flight operations.

§3: Only glider models labeled with the EU registration number may be launched at Braunsberg. Flying with multicopters and FPV models is generally prohibited.

§4: Every pilot must carry a valid EU certificate of competence and the current insurance certificate.

§5: The first pilot present at Braunsberg is the flight director for this day. When leaving the site, the flight director hands over his function to the

pilot who arrived next. The flight director is responsible for ensuring compliance with these flight regulations and the MFBO.

§6: Users of the flying site always act on their own responsibility and at their own risk.

§7: Attention must always be paid to the safety of all flight operations. Take-offs and landings must be announced loudly and clearly. Low-altitude flights over people, animals and vehicles are not permitted. Hikers and visitors to Braunsberg must always be taken into consideration, especially when approaching for landing. If necessary, all persons must be kindly requested to keep the landing area clear before landing.

§8: In the event of intentional or repeated violations of these flight regulations, the flight director has the right and duty to issue an immediate flight ban. Repeated violations of the flight regulations harm the interests of all model pilots. Special incidents, accidents or damage must be reported in writing by the flight director to the board of the 1st HMS as soon as possible (vorstand@hms.wien).
